DESIGN FOR TOY MONEY-BANKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,907, dated November 12, 1878; application filed October 29, 1878.

[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ARNOLD SELIGSBERG, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Toy Banks, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification, and showing a perspective view of a toy bank of my design.

This design consists in the figure having the body, limbs, and feet of a frog, and the face of a man, the said figure sitting upright on its haunches, with one of its fore paws laid open

on the front of its body, and the other of said paws hanging at its side, and grasping a piece of paper money.

What I claim as my invention is-

A design for toy banks, consisting of the figure having the body, limbs, and feet of a frog, and the face of a man, seated in the position substantially as herein shown and described.
