DESIGN FOR A TOY BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 13,400, dated November 7, 1882.

Application filed October 7, 1882. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES F. RITCHEL, a citizen of the United States, residing at Bridgeport, in the county of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Toy Banks, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

10 The drawing is a perspective side view of my newly-designed toy bank.

The general feature of the design consists of the bank made in the form of a monkey or baboon sitting on his haunches, with upraised face and begging or expectant look, and holding up a salver in his arms to receive the offerings to the bank.

20 The leading feature of my design consists of the head *a*, with the upturned face, as shown, the arms *b*, with outstretched hands *c*, having the appearance, in side view, of resting on the knees *d*, the right foot, *e*, advanced beyond the left one, *f*, the latter resting on the edge of the base *g*, and said base having the appearance of the tail of the animal curled around the haunches. The toes *h* of the right foot are represented as stretched out nearly straight, as when resting on the ground; but the toes *i*

of foot *f* are turned nearly perpendicular, as if to reach the ground from the more elevated position of foot *f* on the base *g*. 30

I claim—

1. The design for a toy bank herein shown and described, the same consisting of the form of a monkey sitting on his haunches, with upturned face *a*, and outstretched arms *b c*, said arms having the appearance, in side view, of resting on the knees *d*. 35

2. The design for a toy bank herein shown and described, the same consisting of the form of a monkey sitting on his haunches, with the right foot, *e*, advanced beyond the left one, *f*, the latter having the appearance of resting on the edge of the base *g*, and said base having the appearance of the tail of the animal coiled around the haunches. 45

3. The design for a toy bank herein shown and described, the same consisting of the form of a monkey sitting on his haunches with the right foot, *e*, advanced and the toes *h* thereof outstretched, and with foot *f* resting on base *g*, and the toes *i* thereof turned downward. 50
