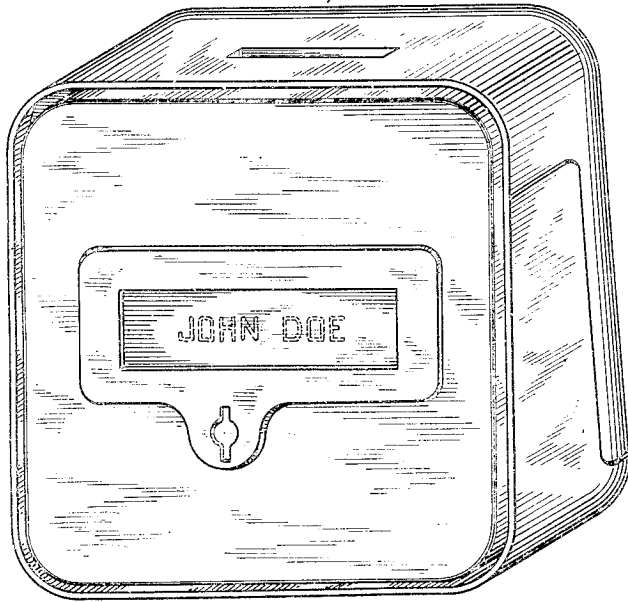

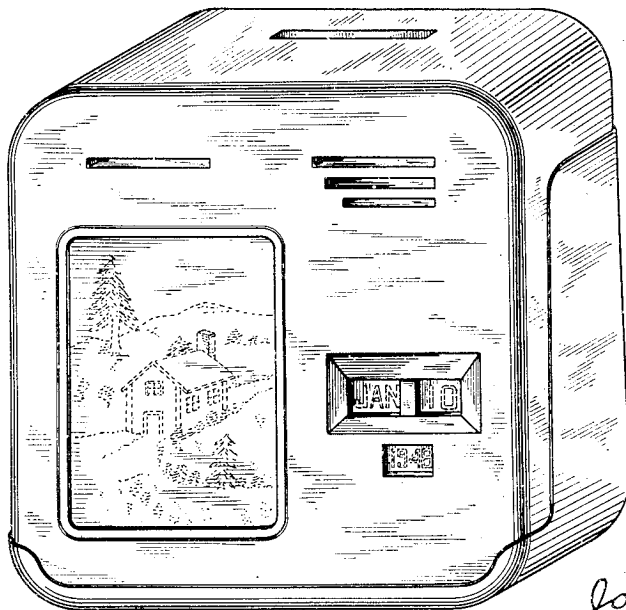
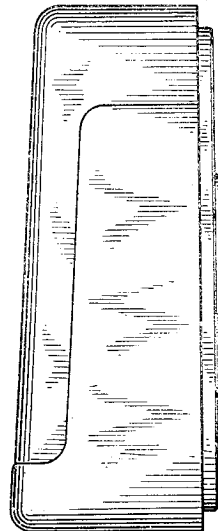

DESIGN FOR A COIN ACTUATED RECORDING BANK

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John E. Gaulke, a citizen of the United States, residing at Milwaukee, in the county of Milwaukee and State of Wisconsin, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Coin Actuated Recording Bank, of which the following is a description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

In the drawing:

Fig. 1 is a front, side and top perspective view showing a coin actuated recording bank embodying my new design;

Fig. 2 is a rear, side and top perspective view of the bank; and

Fig. 3 is a side view thereof.

The dominant features of my design are shown by means of solid lines in the drawing.
