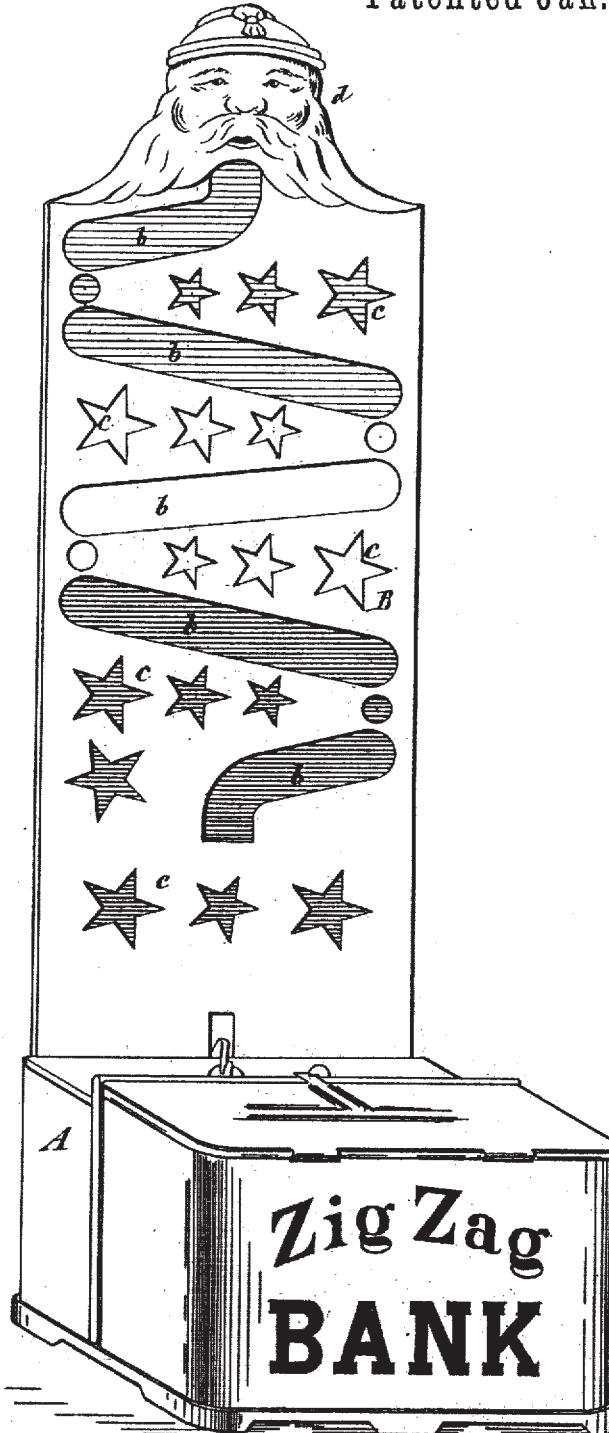

DESIGN FOR A MONEY-BOX.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 19,569, dated January 7, 1890.

Application filed December 9, 1889. Serial No. 333,157. Term of patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, MOSES NEWMAN and GEORGE H. BENNETT, both of New York city, in the county and State of New York, have
5 originated and produced a Design for Money-Boxes, of which the following is a specification.

Our invention relates to a design for a toy money-bank such as are used by children.

The design consists in a money-box having
10 an upright projection, which is an extension of the back of the money-box, in whose face are openings arranged zigzag and surmounted by the representation of a head. The different
15 openings may have behind them different surfaces to form a pleasing contrast.

The accompanying drawing is a perspective view of a toy money-box embodying our design.

A designates the money-box.

20 B designates an upright projection there-

from substantially rectangular in form. In the front of this projection are a number of oblong openings *b*, arranged at reverse inclines and extending nearly across the upright projection, so as to present a zigzag ap-
25 pearance. Star-shaped figures *c* may also be delineated on the front of this projection. At the top of this upright portion is a representation *d* of the head of a man. The upper
30 end of the uppermost opening *b* extends into this head.

What we claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a money-box, substantially as shown and described.
