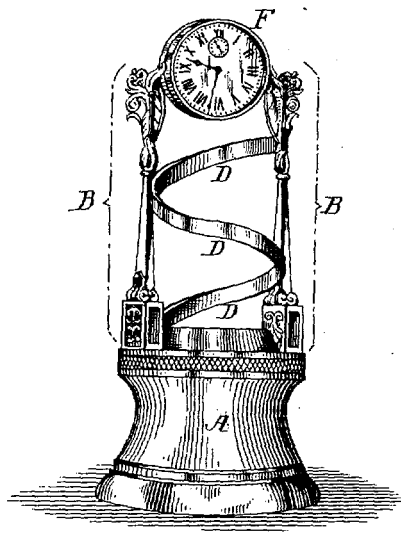

DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 20,086, dated August 12, 1890.

Application filed July 10, 1890. Serial No. 358,353. Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES F. LOCKWOOD, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for a Toy Savings-Bank, of which the following is a specification.

My design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, which represents a perspective view of the toy savings-bank.

The design consists of the base A, the opposite columns or standards B, the spiral strip D, and the clock-face F. The base A has sides partly straight and partly curved, and the columns B have rectangular bases, tapering shafts, and foliated tops. The clock-

face F is located between the columns at the tops of the same, and the spiral strip D, which constitutes one of the main features of the design, extends in its course from column to column.

I claim—

The design for a toy savings-bank, substantially as described, and as shown by the accompanying drawing.
