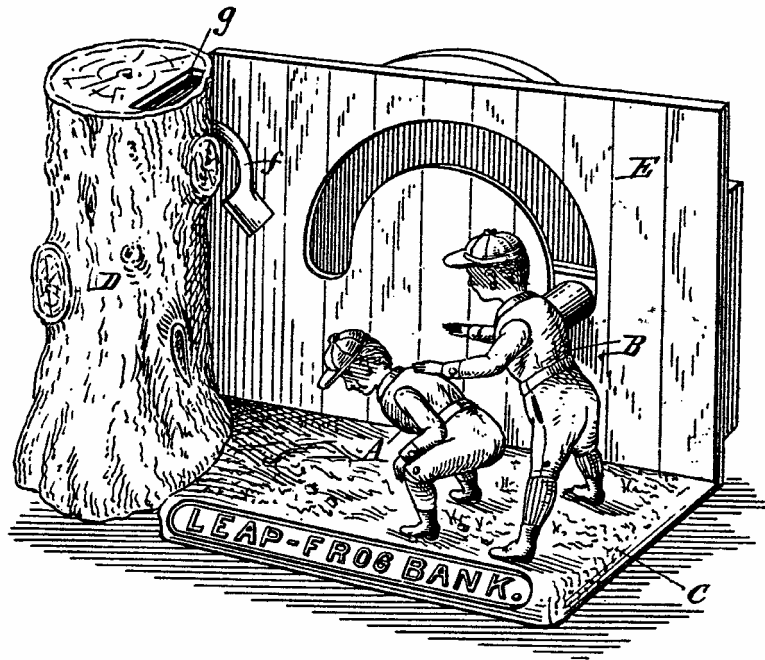

DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 21,036, dated September 15, 1891.

Application filed August 3, 1891. Serial No. 401,585. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, CHARLES G. SHEPARD
and PETER ADAMS, citizens of the United
States, residing at the city of Buffalo, in the
5 county of Erie and State of New York, have
invented and produced a new and original De-
Design for a Toy Savings-Bank, of which the
following is a specification.

This design relates to the configuration of
10 a toy savings-bank, which represents the game
of "leap-frog."

The accompanying drawing, forming part
of this specification, shows a perspective view
of the bank.

15 The leading feature of our design consists
of a stooping figure A and a figure B, repre-
sented as standing in a leaping attitude be-
hind the stooping figure, with its arms ex-

tended above the shoulders of the stooping
figure. The two figures rest upon a base C, 20
at the front end of which is a trunk of a tree
or column D. At the rear side of the base is
a wall or fence E.

f is an arm projecting from the inner side
of the trunk or column, and *g* is an aperture 25
in the top thereof.

What we claim is—

The design for toy savings-banks herein
shown and described.
