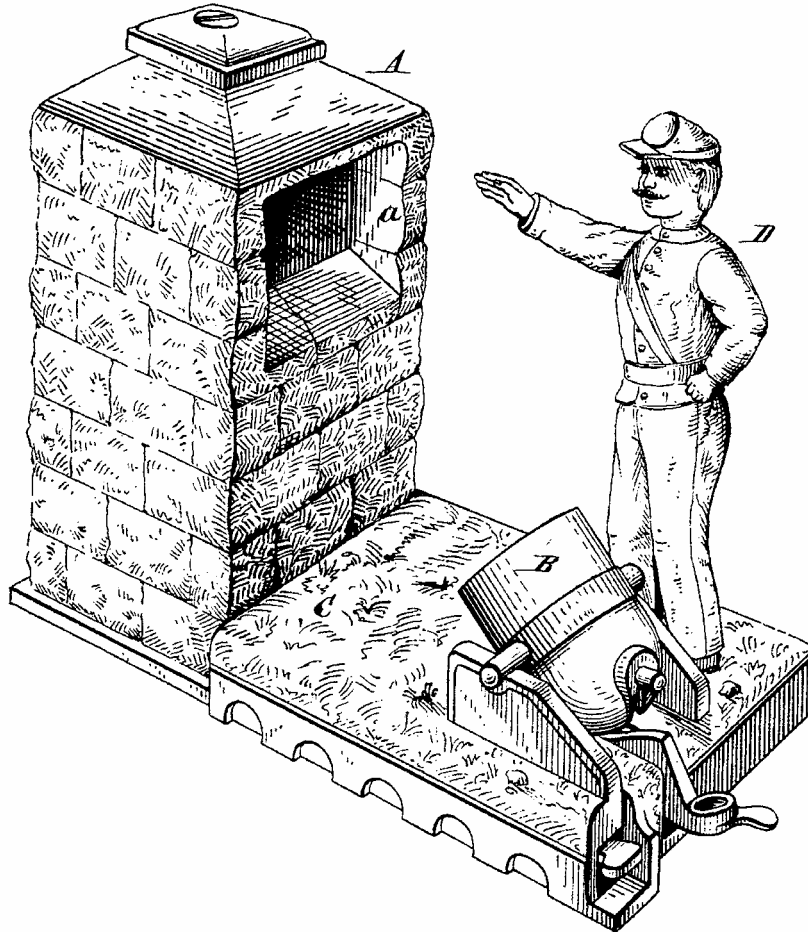

## DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 21,594, dated May 31, 1892.

Application filed May 9, 1892. Serial No. 432,379. Term of patent 7 years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that we, CHARLES G. SHEPARD  
and PETER ADAMS, citizens of the United  
States, residing at Buffalo, in the county of  
5 Erie and State of New York, have invented  
and produced a new and original Design for  
Toy Savings-Banks, of which the following is  
a specification.

This design relates to the general form or  
10 configuration of an ornamental toy savings-  
bank; and it consists of a representation of a  
stone wall or tower, a mortar or cannon fac-  
ing an opening in the tower, and a figure rep-  
resenting a soldier standing to one side of the  
15 mortar or cannon.

Our novel design is clearly represented in  
the accompanying drawing, forming part of  
this specification.

A represents the wall or tower forming the

body of the bank and having an opening a. 20  
B represents a mortar or cannon supported  
upon a base C and facing the opening in the  
wall or tower A, and D represents the figure  
of a soldier standing on the base on one side  
of the mortar or cannon. 25

We claim as our invention—

The design for a toy savings-bank herein  
shown and described, the same comprising a  
wall or tower, a mortar facing the tower, and  
a figure representing a soldier standing near 30  
the mortar, substantially as set forth.
