



DESIGN FOR A TOY BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 35,159, dated October 1, 1901.

Application filed August 23, 1900. Serial No. 27,856. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES A. BAILEY, a citizen of the United States, residing at Cromwell, in the county of Middlesex and State of 5 Connecticut, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Toy Banks, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

This design is for a toy bank for children; and the object in view is to provide a bank of this particular character which shall be attractive, ornamental, and pleasing in appear-

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a plan view, and Fig. 2 a perspective view, of

the design.

Referring to said drawings, A designates the base portion or box, the said box being 20 rectangular in shape with rounded ends, and the sides thereof are ornamented with flowers a, leaves a', and grasses a^2 in relief, as shown, and projecting upward from this base portion or box is a part or figure B, representing a 25 hen in a squatting position with wings b low-

ered, a projection b' in the shape of a head of a small chick extending above the wing. In front of this figure or hen B is a second figure C, representing a young chick, and in the upper part of the base portion or box A is 30 formed a slot a^3 , the said slot being located in front of the aforesaid figures.

The essential or material features of the design for a toy bank comprise the base portion or box A, a figure of a fowl mounted 35 thereon, and a chick upon the box in front of

the other figure, as herein shown.

Having described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The design for a toy bank, as herein shown

and described.
