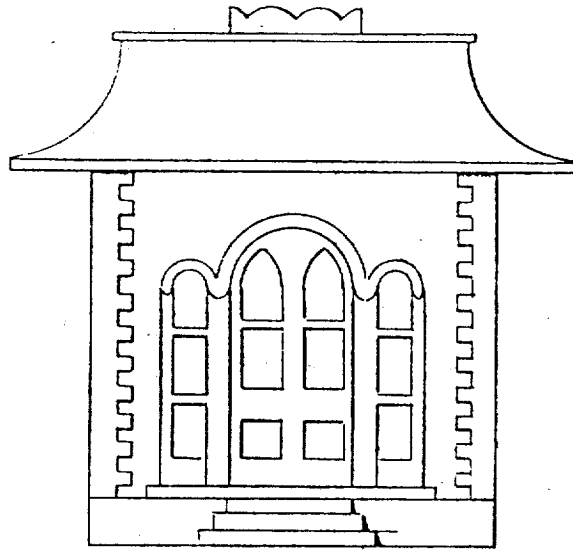

DESIGN FOR A TOY BANK.

Specification forming part of Design No. 6,016, dated July 30, 1872.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DORAS A. STILES, of Middletown, in the county of Middlesex and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for a Toy Bank; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawing constitutes part of this specification, and represents, in—

Figure 1, a front view.

This invention relates to a design for a toy bank made from cast metal—a modification of a patent for a design granted to me June 25, 1872, having especial reference to the construction of the roof. In that design a roof was formed with dormer-windows. This design

consists of a peculiar configuration of the roof—that is to say, a toy bank having a Mansard roof, but without windows, as shown in the before-mentioned design. The body of the house I prefer and make as shown in the drawing. The roof projects from the body and rises on a curved incline to a flat deck in the style called “Mansard,” but without representation of dormer-windows, as shown in the accompanying drawing.

I claim—

The design for a toy bank, as shown and described.
