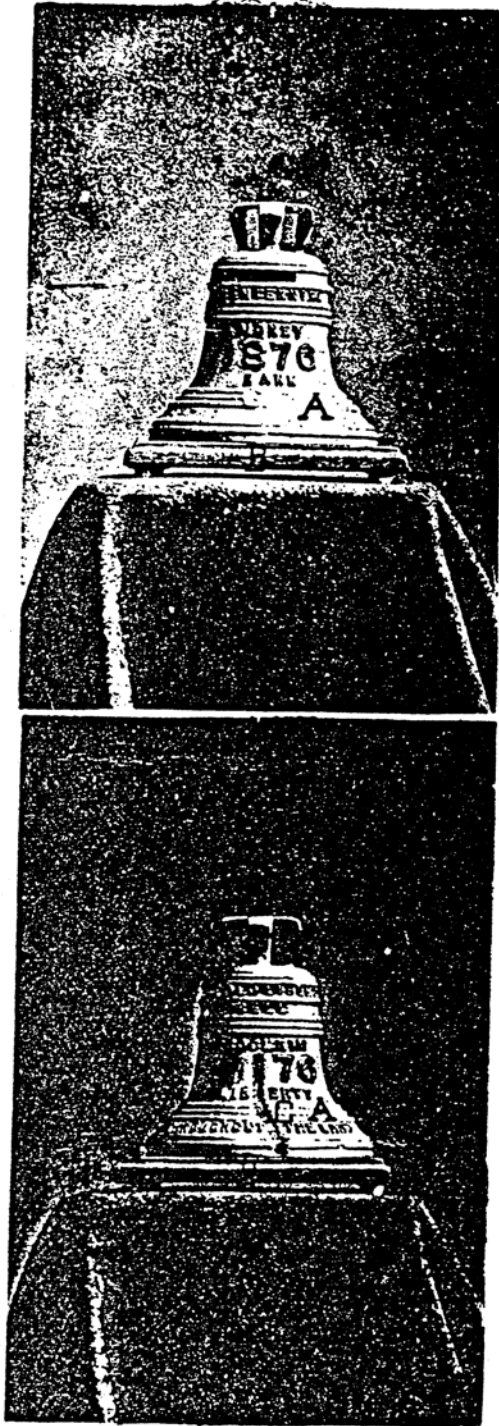

## DESIGN FOR A TOY MONEY-BANK.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,655**, dated September 21, 1875; application filed August 24, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, CANDIDE W. CRÔTEAU, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Toy Money-Bank, of which the following is a specification:

My design, which is too fully illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing to need minute description, consists of a representation of the tower of Independence Hall, Philadelphia. The sides of the tower, or the base upon which it stands, may be inscribed with any appropriate lettering; but this is not important, and forms no feature of my design.

I claim—

The design for a toy money bank, having the form and appearance of the tower of Independence Hall, Philadelphia, substantially as described, and as illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
